1. National Police Week, May 10-16

In October 1962, President John F. Kennedy designated May 15 of each year as Peace Officers Memorial Day to honor the Federal, State, and municipal officers who die or are disabled in the line of duty. He also designated the week in which Peace Officers Memorial Day falls (May 10-16, 2009) as Police Week.

During National Police Week, the D'Iberville Police Department encourages the display of blue ribbons on car antennas. C.O.P.S. (**Concerns of Police Survivors**) distributes over 1,000,000 blue ribbons prior to National Police Week to law enforcement agencies to display on cruiser antennas. D'Iberville Police Department Personnel will tie blue ribbons to cruiser antennas in recognition of National Police Week. All City employees are also encouraged to display C.O.P.S. (**Concerns of Police Survivors**) blue ribbons on their city vehicles. These blue ribbons are a reminder of law enforcement personnel who have made the ultimate sacrifice.

Citizens are encouraged to tie blue ribbons to their car antennas. Any strip of royal blue ribbon will work.

3. Ms Office of Highway Safety Click it –Rock the Belt (Teen Drivers) May 11-17,2009

D'Iberville Police Department is joining forces with other Law enforcement Agencies and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration **Launches "TEEN DEMO- CLICK IT OR TICKET"** In 2007 alone, more than 1 in 10 drivers (12.5%) involved in fatal crashes across the United States were 15 to 20 years old. In fact, an alarming 61 percent of all 15- to 20-year-old passenger vehicle occupants killed in fatal crashes in 2007 were NOT wearing their seat belts.

That's why **D'Iberville Police Department, District One County Patrol, and Harrison County Sheriff's Department's School Resource Officers** are joining together in supporting an aggressive initiative *Teen Demo - Click It or Ticket* seat belt enforcement campaign from May 13 through May 17. Police will be handing out Digital Media Cards to those teens that are buckled up. Those teens that are not buckled up will be given an E Grip for their cell phone to remind them to buckle up. We started May 13th, 2:45 pm at D'Iberville High School and will continue through the weekend. We urge you to join this year's national *Click It or Ticket* effort by encouraging everyone, and especially students, to buckle up every trip, every time — day and night. Together we can help prevent the unnecessary and tragic loss of teenage life to motor vehicle crashes. Thank you for participating in this important national safety initiative. National Click it- or Ticket campaign is from May 18 through May 31, 2009

The D'Iberville Police Department is joining forces for the Memorial Day weekend with other Law enforcement Agencies and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration to spread the message **"Drunk Driving, Over the limit, Under Arrest."** The Police department will be out in force making sure drunk drivers are off the road, we want everyone to have a safe and Happy Memorial Day weekend, however, there are consequences of drunk driving. The D'Iberville Police Department encourages you to designate a sober driver and not letting friends drive drunk as just two of several simple steps to avoid a tragic crash or an arrest for impaired driving.

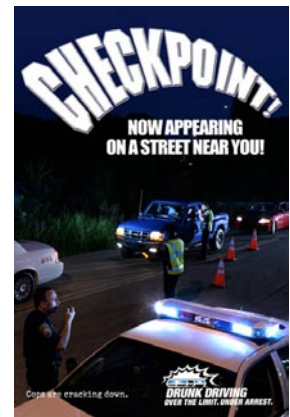
