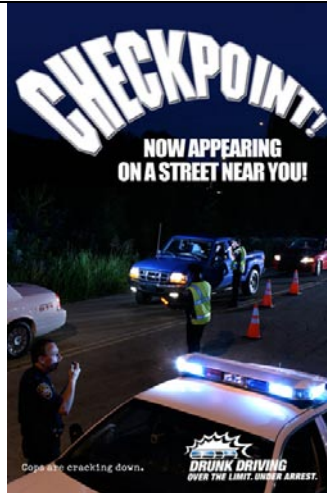

### Patrol Division

The patrol Division captured three fugitives this week. Andrew Sanders from Vancleave, Ms who was wanted for possession of cocaine charges out of Joliet, Illinois and Sean Susey from Ocean Springs, Ms was wanted for Larceny charges out of Ohio. Kristie Davis out of Biloxi, Ms was wanted for Grand Larceny out of Biloxi. All Three Subjects are in the Harrison County Jail, Mr. Sanders and Mr. Susey are waiting Extradition. On May 18 Patrol Units were called to Automall Parkway where a 2" natural gas line was busted by construction workers. Again on May 21 Patrol Units were again called to a gas leak on D'Iberville Blvd. where another construction crew busted a main natural gas line. There were no injuries at either natural gas leak. The Patrol Division also made a traffic stop on May 19 for a vehicle running a red light and Officers found approximately a pound of Marijuana in the vehicle. Three subjects were turned over to Criminal Investigations and arrested for Possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute.

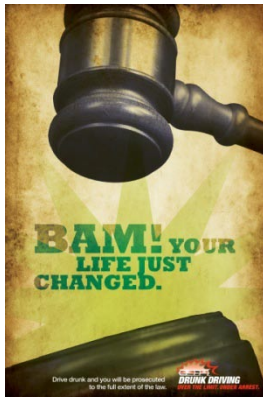
