- **D'IBERVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT ASSUME FULL LAW ENFORCEMENT RESPONSIBILITY**

What a great day in the History of the City Of D'Iberville. The long awaited day finally arrives, at 6 am October 1, 2008; Police Officers employed by the City of D'Iberville began patrolling the streets. This is one of last crucial element of our city's identity...Your D'Iberville Police Department. The city of D'Iberville held a changing of the guard ceremony on Wednesday October 1, 2008 at 8:00 A.M. in front of City hall, in attendance were City leaders, politician, Dignitaries, law enforcement, and our citizens, I would guess about 100 in attendance. I will post the speech I gave at the end of the weekly report.

Crime report; the D'Iberville Police department assisted DEA with a drug arrest, four individuals were arrested for delivery of a controlled substance. 5 Domestic Violence, 1 DUI, 1 grand Larceny, 1 attempted Burglary, 2 Burglaries. At 6am October 1, 2008 to 6 am October 2, 2008, the follow is a run down of calls for service for the police department: 68 total calls for service 3 accidents one of which was a hit and run, 90 checking areas, 27 Vehicle contact, Grand Larceny and Burglary at a local business arrested one(1) and a shoplifting. At about 6pm today Officers responded to a fight call at Meadows and spring dale, when officers arrived there was a large group of people in the street with several of them fighting, the officers requested additional assistance, order was restored and a total of four were arrested (3)- Juveniles and (1) adult. The adult had to be transported by AMR to the Hospital for injuries received in the fight, he will be incarcerated at the Harrison County Jail. We have placed the area on extra patrol.

Press release: D'Iberville Chief of Police Wayne Payne announced the arrest of Shquinn Haynes ,B/M 18 years of age of Biloxi. On October 2, 2008, D'Iberville Police Officers responded to the first burglary, reported to the city's new police department. Within the hour, Officers and Investigators had identified the person responsible for the crime.

Acting on a report of a stolen vehicle from the business burglarized, officers identified several key pieces of evidence linking the suspect to the burglary and auto theft.

Captain Keith Davis of the Criminal Investigations Division stated the suspect admitted culpability to the crimes during an interrogation. Captain Davis said once the suspect realized all of the evidence the police department had uncovered, he did not hesitate corroborating the facts.

This arrest marks the first official felony investigation conducted by the D'Iberville Police Department. Chief Payne said he is pleased with the work of his officers. However, he is more interested in reducing crimes in the city. Chief

Payne said he has challenged his officers to be pro-active in locating and arresting every suspect who willfully breaks and enters any property in the D'Iberville community.

Captain Davis said Haynes was incarcerated in the Harrison County Adult Detention Center under a \$50,000.00 bond set by Justice Court Judge Bruce Strong.

much for this city and the law enforcement substation. Bobby Thank You! Supervisor Windy Swetman, who before being elected, was the officer in charge of the D'Iberville officers.
