

Criminal Investigations Division

June activities for Criminal Investigation Division

- Investigators worked a fake kidnapping report on June 30, 2013 when Taylor Neville reported to her mother that she had been kidnapped by her ex-boyfriend. Mrs. Neville was found and charged with intimidating judge, juror, witness, attorney, etc, or otherwise obstructing justice.
- On June 10, 2013 investigators began working an armed robbery case at 4008 Popps Ferry Road. Derrick Bryant was arrested for armed robbery and aggravated assault. He was booked in at the Harrison County Adult Detention Center on a \$100,000.00 bond.
- Investigators worked a sexual battery case on June 25, 2013. This case is currently under investigation.
- On June 22, 2012 Criminal Investigations Division began working a case of \$52,000.00 of forfeiture money.

Criminal Investigations Current Activity

- Ethan Smith was convicted of murder on June 10, 2013. He was sentenced to life in prison.
- Jeffrey Williams plead guilty to exploitation of a child and touching a child for lustful purpose. He was sentenced to 55 years day for day in prison.
- Lieutenant Terry Hines is leaving on August 10, 2013 to attend SPI school in Kentucky.

On June 9, 2013, Officers responded to 4008 Popps Ferry Rd. (Texaco) in response to an armed robbery. A subsequent investigation revealed the suspect, Derrick Bryant jumped across the counter brandishing a knife and cut the clerk on the hand.
